¶ THE PUBLIC ORATOR *will read the Loyal Address.*

¶ THE CHANCELLOR *will then make a short speech in English.*

¶ H.M. THE KING *will reply.*

¶ THE CHANCELLOR *will then dissolve CONVOCATION with a Latin formula, and the procession will leave the Theatre, the audience standing in their places.*
