Dear Miss Izambard,

There is one more man whom you should add to your list; and that is Professor Jean Wahl. I didn't write you earlier regarding Wahl, simply because his case sounded hopeless at first, as he had been put into a concentration camp in Occupied France. He is out, however, and has even been able to get to Lyon; so that you may soon have to assist him.

Prof. Wahl is French. He was formerly Professor of Philosophy at the Sorbonne. He is fifty years of age. He is not married and would not be accompanied by any member of his family. On October 2, 1941 the Foundation made a total grant of \$3,750 to the New School, of which \$3,000 (\$1,500 a year) is to be used for Wahl's salary and \$750 for his travel expenses. He is a friend of Prof. Koyre, who as you know is now in New York. An application was recently presented to the State Department on behalf of Prof. Wahl, and we hope that prompt action by the State Department will enable Prof. Wahl to start on his journey within the not too distant future. I do not know Wahl's address in Lyon, but will try to find out some time to-day, and will add a postscript at the end of this page before mailing my letter to you.

There is nothing for you to do about Wahl for the time being, until you hear from us that his visa application has been approved. When this has been approved, you must ascertain from Wahl whether he has a French exit permit, and then you can proceed with steamship reservations.
