My dear President Rose,

I appreciate very much your kindness in offering to confer personally with me as regards my application to the International Education Board on behalf of the Institute of Theoretical Physics at Copenhagen. I will be staying

here in Amherst untill the beginning of November, when I am going to New Haven where I shall deliver the Tillingham Lecture within the first two weeks of that month.

If it is convenient for you I shall be glad to come to New York from New Haven any day I am not actually lecturing at Yale University. Thus I should be glad to come any time on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> or 16<sup>th</sup> of November, which will be convenient to you. In the following weeks I have arranged to visit the University of Chicago and some other Institutions, but shall thereafter be staying in New York
