Although the Committee has expressed its views with reference to the desirability of establishing an oceanographic institute on the Atlantic Coast, I assume that the Committee would not be disposed to take any definite action in the matter until after completion of the study of the field of oceanography in this country and abroad, mentioned in our conference at Chicago. At that time you indicated that the Committee would need funds for employing a man to represent it in getting together the necessary facts upon which to base a program.
