Dear Professor Bohr:

At a meeting of the International Education Board held May 26, 1934, your letter of April 16 in which you nominate Doctor Heisenberg and Mr. Rosseland for a fellowship in science, was presented to the Board.

It gives me pleasure to inform you that the Board authorized its executive officers in their discretion to commit the Board to an appropriation of the sum not exceeding \$1,000 plus traveling expenses from Göttingen to Copenhagen and return, to Doctor Heisenberg to enable him to study for one year, commencing September 1, 1934, at the Institute for Theoretical Physics, University of Copenhagen, Copenhagen, Denmark, and an appropriation of the sum not exceeding \$1440 plus travel to the United States and return, to Mr. Rosseland to enable him to continue his studies in astro-physics at the Mount Wilson Observatory, Pasadena, California, for one year, commencing September 1, 1934.

It is the custom of the Board to make payments on fellowships in four installments. Payments on Mr. Heisenberg's fellowship will be made to him through you, the first payment being sent to you

on or about August 1, 1934. Payments on Mr. Rosseland's fellowship will be made to him through Dr. Walter S. Adams, the first payment being due on Mr. Rosseland's arrival in this country.

The matter of travel in both cases will be taken care of by Thomas Cook and Son who will no doubt communicate with Doctor Heisenberg and Mr. Rosseland in the near future.

Will you kindly inform the men of the Board's action?
